The flying itself works very well. The Diamond Twin Star (DA42), World Flyer, is wonderful to fly! It has really got the equipment we need and the glass cockpit (see picture below) is really a good help when you are flying into new areas. The NavAero system that makes our cockpit paperless (all charts are digital) makes our flying even better. Instead of loading bunches of paper charts in the aircraft we are now only carrying a slimmed computer that has all the charts in the world stored in it. The Bose head sets are absolutely fantastic. They give a crystal clear sound that makes the communication so much easier.



Inbound Croatia

FSI, Flight Service International, does a great job providing us with all landing permits and over flight permits. They facilitate the project very much! We encountered difficult weather conditions over Europe as we had much icing conditions over Albania, Greece and Macedonia. As we had to fly back to Austria to fix some smaller problems with the aircraft we had to be exposed in these weathers more. Diamond has done a great job providing us with good service and we really appreciate this

kind of aircraft to anyone interested. We have already found two seriously interested buyers of the aircraft along our way!



World Flight for Hearing continues eastbound. We plan to be back in Europe again in the end of August and we hope that we can do much for the hearing impaired people in the world. Please help us arrange activities along our way! The project has really proved to give much effect and attracts media to a high extent.
